I continue to be amazed at how the time passes so quickly. Maybe it has something to do with getting older but I hope not. Be that as it may, here I am sitting down to pound out another newsletter which means another month has slipped away.

We have just ended the Sundays after the Epiphany and are looking at observing another Season of Lent. By the time you read this we may have celebrated another Mardi Gras with all the trimming and once again enjoyed the fellowship with our friends and neighbors that has been so much a part of what St. James is all about.

Hopefully, you also will have participated in Ash Wednesday which is one of the several Days of Obligation on the Church calendar. While there are a number of these special days listed in the Book of Common Prayer, we have unfortunately not observed all of them in the past. However, Lent is one of the seasons on the calendar that most people, even non-Christians are familiar with. For followers of Christ, Lent is meant to be a time for fasting and reflection. It is meant to be a time when we can take a long hard look at how we live out our daily lives and seek to seriously attempt to change those things in our lives that are displeasing to God.

While it has been a practice for some to “give up” something for Lent to symbolize their desire to sacrifice something to God during these 40 days, I have always suggested that people consider “doing” something special during the coming days rather than giving up something. Spend extra time in prayer. Find a good book that will speak to your spirit. Take time to visit with those who would benefit from your shared time. Rather than “giving up chocolate” for example for Lent, consider performing an act of kindness for someone each week during this meaningful season.

We will experience a number of changes in our worship service each week during Lent. We will use Rite I which represents the older more traditional Prayer Book service. The language is just different enough that we will have to pay more attention to what we are saying. We will go back and use the blue Hymnal again singing hymns that may be less familiar, but hopefully edifying. There will be no flowers on the altar during Lent and vestments will be minimal. All that is done has a purpose which is to help us to look forward and focus on the events of Holy Week and ultimately the glorious celebration on Easter morning.

I will be starting a new series on the beliefs and practices of the Episcopal Church during T.E.A.C.H. and I encourage everyone to plan to take part as it should be a study that we will all enjoy and benefit from.

Finally, we have a several people who are experiencing a number of medical issues. While our prayer team prays for each of these people by name when they meet each Tuesday, I encourage each of you to join with them in praying for one another in your daily prayers. Be reminded that your vestry members are also praying for each of you each day as well. Your ongoing commitment to pray for one another and for the mission of your church is what has allowed St. James Church to continue to move forward through the good times and the bad. As Bishop Stanton used to acknowledge, prayer has been one of the things that has set our congregation apart; and God has blessed us in a mighty way because of your faithfulness in lifting one another up in prayer. Rooted in scripture and grounded in prayer...may these things always be the foundation of St. James Church.
